BYELAWS

made by the Mayor, Alder and Burgesses of the Borough of Guildford, acting by the Council under section 164 of the Public Health Act, 1875, with respect to the Pleasure Grounds known as Shalford Park and the part or parts of Stoke Park appropriated by the Council under sub-section (4) of section 66 of the Guildford Corporation Act, 1926, for the purposes of a public walk pleasure ground public park or recreation ground and indicated by a notice exhibited in a conspicuous position at each entrance thereto.

- 1. Throughout these byelaws the expression "the Council" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Guildford acting by the Council, the expression "the pleasure ground" means each part of the please grounds known as Shalford Park and the part or parts of Stoke Park appropriated by the Council and indicated by the notices aforesaid.
- 2. A person shall not in the pleasure ground drive, pitch or chip a solid golf ball.

Provided that this prohibition shall not apply to any putting green provided by the Council in the pleasure ground.

3. Every person who shall offend against these byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Two Pounds
