Sallie was born and went to school in London. She chose to study at Bangor University in North Wales to train as a teacher, as she enjoyed climbing mountains! She has been passionate about sport ever since.

Sallie taught Physical Education for eight years and moved to Guildford in 1988 for her last role, as Head of PE at Heathside School in Weybridge. The same year she moved to the centre of Guildford. During her teaching career Sallie began her commitment to public service, serving as an Officer in the Territorial Army for nearly 20 years.



After one cold and snowy winter Sallie decided teaching was not for her and she moved into sports administration. She joined the GB Sports Council, which later became Sport England, and finished her career as Chief Operating Officer for the Sport and Recreation Alliance.

Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion

Throughout her career, Sallie has focused on the positive benefits of sport in addressing inclusion, diversity, and opportunity. She has a particular interest in promoting women and girls in sport. She organised the first International Women and Sport Conference in 1984 and was a member of the team that drafted the Brighton Declaration on Women and Sport. It includes a set of principles for sports organisations to develop gender equality in sport and physical activity and is still relevant today.

For her services to sport, Sallie was awarded an MBE from Queen Elizabeth II in 2017.

Since her retirement in 2015, Sallie has continued to promote the benefits of physical activity in addressing issues of equality and inclusion. Sallie was Chair of the organising committee for the Women's World Lacrosse Championships, held at Surrey Sports Park in 2017, and she is currently Chair of British Blind Sport and organised the World Blind Games in Birmingham, in August 2023.



Links with our town and villages

On her retirement, Sallie wanted to put something back into the community she loves and to continue her commitment to public service by developing even closer links to our town and surrounding villages by getting involved with a number of community groups and organisations. These include:

- Guildford Spike WI where she was President for 4 years.

Sallie was elected as a Guildford Borough Councillor for Pilgrims Ward in May 2023 and was subsequently appointed as Deputy Mayor for the municipal year 2023-24.

Sallie is keen to use the knowledge, experiences, and skills she has gained from her voluntary and public roles to benefit the residents in Guildford and surrounding villages.

Sallie lives in Guildford with her partner, Phil. They enjoy living in the centre of Guildford for the many social opportunities on offer but also enjoy taking long walks in the nearby countryside. They have 27 goldfish in their garden pond and a 10-year-old cat, Harry who spends his time trying to catch them!
