

Provide a general description of the premises.	Kirat Rai House, Gambles Lane, Ripley, Surrey GU23 6HS is a community cultural premises owned and managed by the Kirat Rai community in the United Kingdom. The site consists of a community building and surrounding open land used for cultural gatherings, traditional ceremonies, and community events. The premises will be used to host the annual Ubhauri (Sakela / Sakewa) Festival organised by Kirat Rai Yayokkha UK. The event is a traditional cultural celebration of the Kirat Rai indigenous community of Nepal and includes a large number of British Gurkha veterans, serving personnel, and their families living in the United Kingdom. The celebration includes ceremonial Silli dances, cultural performances, traditional drum and chyamble music, community gatherings, and traditional food. For the event, the outdoor grounds surrounding Kirat Rai House will be used for the main festival activities. The layout includes a central Silli dance area, a stage for announcements and cultural performances, food stalls, community stalls, temporary toilet facilities, a first aid and welfare area, and designated parking areas. The event will take place on Saturday 23 May 2026 from 09:00 to 19:00. The festival is expected to attract approximately 3000–4000 attendees throughout the day, including members of the Kirat Rai community and visitors from across the United Kingdom. Alcohol, where provided, will be supplied within a designated bar area and consumed within the licensed event area. The event will be stewarded by trained volunteers and professional security personnel, and appropriate safety, traffic management, and welfare arrangements will be in place. The festival is a family-friendly cultural event aimed at preserving Kirat Rai cultural heritage and promoting community cohesion.

Activities include traditional Silli dance, cultural performances, community gatherings, and food stalls. There will be no adult entertainment, nudity, age-restricted films, gaming machines, or any activities of a nature that may give rise to concern in respect of children. Children attending the event will be accompanied by their parents or guardians, and appropriate supervision will be maintained throughout the event. Event stewards and volunteers will be present to assist with the safe management of attendees. Alcohol will only be sold within a designated bar area and will be operated by trained staff in accordance with the Challenge 25 policy, ensuring that alcohol is not sold to persons under the age of 18.</p>

A) General - all four licensing objectives	<p>The Ubhauri (Sakela/Sakewa) Festival organised by Kirat Rai Yayokkha UK is a traditional cultural event celebrating the heritage of the Kirat Rai community. The event will take place at Kirat Rai House. The event is expected to attract approximately 3000–4500 attendees throughout the day, with numbers present at any one</p>

	<p>time remaining below 5000. The festival will be organised and supported by the Executive Committee Members and volunteers of Kirat Rai Yayokkha (KRY) UK, many of whom are retired British Gurkha Army personnel, bringing significant experience in organisation, discipline, and public safety management. Professional licensed security personnel will be hired to support the safe operation of the event. In addition, medical support including trained medics and an ambulance will be present on site throughout the event to respond to any medical emergencies. The organisers will implement appropriate event management procedures to promote the four licensing objectives: prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, prevention of public nuisance, and protection of children from harm.</p>
<p>B) Prevention Description</p>	<p>Professional licensed security personnel, together with event stewards and volunteers, will monitor the premises throughout the event to maintain order and ensure the safety of attendees. The event will be supervised by members of the Executive Committee and volunteers of Kirat Rai Yayokkha UK. Alcohol will be sold only within a designated bar area and operated by trained staff. The Challenge 25 policy will be implemented to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18. Any incidents of disorder or anti-social behaviour will be addressed promptly by event stewards and security staff, and where necessary appropriate action will be taken to maintain a safe and orderly environment. Security personnel and stewards will monitor entry points and the designated bar area to ensure responsible alcohol consumption and to prevent overcrowding within the licensed premises.</p>
<p>C) Public Safety Description</p>	<p>Appropriate safety arrangements will be in place including professional licensed security personnel, trained event stewards and volunteers, supported by members of the Executive Committee of Kirat Rai Yayokkha UK. First aid provision, on-site trained medics and an ambulance will be present throughout the event to respond to any medical incidents. Temporary toilet facilities will be provided, and clear emergency access routes will be maintained at all times for emergency services. Crowd movement, entrances and exits will be monitored by security staff and stewards to ensure safe access and dispersal of attendees. The organisers will monitor attendance levels to ensure the event operates safely throughout the day.</p>
<p>D) Public Nuisance Description</p>	<p>Music and announcements will be controlled through a managed PA system and will take place only during the permitted hours of the licence. The organisers will monitor sound levels to minimise disturbance to neighbouring properties. Event stewards and volunteers will assist with the orderly arrival and dispersal of attendees to reduce congestion and disturbance in the surrounding area. Waste management and litter collection will be organised during and after the event to maintain the cleanliness of the premises and</p>
